PURPOSE OF A WINDOW



Identifies hidden child predators and the institutions that endanger children



Shifts the cost of abuse from the victims and taxpayers to those who caused it

CHILD SEX ABUSE VICTIMS ON AVERAGE. **COME FORWARD AT AGE 52**

That means your child is being educated, coached, and mentored by people who were abusing kids up to 40 years ago and no one knows.

DELAYED DISCLOSURE

Delayed disclosure is the phenomenon common to survivors of child sex abuse where individuals wait for years, often well into adulthood, before telling anyone they were abused













Perpetrators were shielded from criminal prosecution and survivors were barred from filing civil claims long before they were able to disclose their abuse because of historically short statutes of limitations across the U.S.
