

SUPREME COURT CASES DEFENDING VACCINATION LAW

A state can impose “reasonable regulations” to protect public health, including a vaccination mandate, even when the regulation burdens individual rights.

JACOBSON v. MASSACHUSETTS,
197 U.S. 11, 29 (1905).

"The right to practice religion freely does not include the right to expose the community or the child to communicable disease or the latter to ill-health or death."

PRINCE v. MASSACHUSETTS,
321 U.S. 158, 166-67 (1994).
